







The combination restaurant & sports bar will be occupying the entire first floor of The Boardwalk on Lake Anna - the new commercial building on Route 522. FEMA Approves Aid for Mineral Earthquake Damage

On November 4, The U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) announced that federal disaster aid has been made available to the State of Virginia from damage resulting from the August 23rd earthquake, centered in Mineral. The assistance will be comprised of grants for temporary housing and home repairs, low-cost loans to

cover those uninsured for earthquake damage, and other programs to help civilians and businesses to recover from the effets incurred from the largest earthquake this state has seen in a century.

The FEMA recover plan is also to include additional benefits to those who have been effected by the earthquake. There is an extended unemployment payment program for up to 26 weeks for anyone who temporarily lost their job due to the disaster and are not continued on page 3

Partnership addresses unauthorized email, elects board members

The Lake Anna Business Partnership met on Tuesday, Oct. 18, at The Nuclear Information Center at the North Anna Power Plant. During the meeting, partnership member Libby Sandridge, asked Dick Dickens, president, about an unauthorized email that had been transmitted to the membership by a board of directors member. According to Dickens, the email in question was sent approximately three weeks prior to the Oct. 18 meeting concerning a local group's septic system.

Dickens responded, "All of you should have got, most of you probably did get an unauthorized email that covered several subjects. About the fourth paragraph down there was a paragraph on a treatment plant, expansion of a treatment plant as proposed by Mr. Snyder's group."

Dickens said the reason he had put out a clarification was that it appeared to him that the Lake Anna Partnership was against treatment plants, or against that particular project.

"The Partnership would never come out against a well designed, hi-tech, state of the art treatment plant.

"That's not true," said Dickens. "The Lake Anna Partnership has no official position either way. We don't know enough about it," he continued.

Dickens said he would relay his strictly personal opinion based on his experience as an architectural engineer and 25 years of land development management.

"The Partnership would never come out against a well designed, hitech, state of the art treatment plant. That's ridiculous," he continued.

"As I said in this room a few months ago, a senior representative of DEQ, Department of Environmental Quality, spoke highly in favor of package treatment plants," said Dickens.

Dickens told the group, "The fact is that every drainfield around the lake sooner or later is going to fail. Whether it is five years, or 50 years they are all going to fail and when they do that's when it [effluent] will get to the lake. Package treatment plants are the future of rural residential development."

Dickens said he thought the board would do more research and meet with a representative from DEQ and State Department of Health in order to be better educated.

Dickens concluded by stressing his point that the email had originated from one director and did not speak for the Partnership.

In other news, the members at large elected the 2012 board of director members. Nominees included Jeff Martin, Ben Waddy, Dr. Russell Beattie, Jill Gajarsky, Joel Kendall, Bill Fosdick, Jeff Heidig, Ron Gentry, C.C. McCotter, and Donna Stocking.

qualified for traditional state benefits.

Low interest loans are available for up to \$200,000 for primary residences that sustained losses and up to \$40,000 for personal property. Small businesses, small agricultural cooperatives and non-profit organizations who have encountered disaster-related cash flow problems are also eligible for assistance.

Those who have sustained losses can file for assistance immediately by registering online at www.DisasterAssistance.gov or by calling 1-800-621-FEMA (3362). The toll-free number will operate from 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. for seven days a week until further notice.

Assistance to Virginia had previously been denied, but the declaration on November 4th was a huge boost to the area.

FEMA's mission is to support our citizens and first responders to ensure that as a nation we work together to build, sustain, and improve our capability to prepare for, protect against, respond to, recover from, and mitigate all hazards.

Loans are available for primary residences, small businesses, non-profit organizations, and other entities that have been directly effected by the disaster.

NRC Discusses Inspections & Assessments Following Quake

Several of Dominion Power's top brass were on hand at the Louisa County Middle School Tuesday, Nov. 1, along with members of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission, NRC, to discuss its inspections of the North Anna Nuclear Power Station and its assessment of the plant's readiness to restart following the Aug. 23 earthquake.

David Heacock, President and Chief Nuclear Officer, made the presentation to approximately 300 citizens for Dominion. Heacock reviewed the inspection process saying that more than 100,000 hours and \$21 million had been spent in inspection, testing and evaluation of the plant, which exceeded the NRC's endorsed guidelines. According to Heacock there was no functional damage to safety systems and the units at the plant are ready for restart. Explaining the effects of the earthquake Heacock told the group, "The plant tells the story."

Plant damage included a base pedestal in the Unit 2 turbine building, a crack in unreinforced non safety re-

lated block wall, also in the turbine building, and a surface crack in Unit 1's interior containment wall. Heacock also stated that some dry cask storage units moved between one and four and one half inches. With no significant damage found, Heacock told the group that the plant is safe to operate and the units are ready for restart.

Members of the NRC also made a presentation on the status of NRC inspection and a review of their activities as related to the North Anna Power Station seismic event. NRC officials told the group that Dominion surpassed the NRC guidelines and that there was no safety concerns as a result of the seismic event. Eric Leeds, NRC, Director of Nuclear Reactor Regulation, said that the inspection was still in progress but that the team would not allow the plant to start until everything was deemed safe.

However, later in the question and answer session Victor McCree, NRC Administrator of the Region II Office, stated that authorization to restart the plant is expected in the next week or so.



Benefit Gives Back

It was a crisp, early fall day at Christopher Run Campground. You could even say it was unusually chilly for the first day of October. But the lower temperatures didn't stop the scads of locals, out of towners, and water sport professionals from coming together for a common cause - the "Earth-Qwake" benefit bash. This benefit was brought to life by a newly-established foundation called Wake Savers, headed by local do-gooder and water sports aficionado, Kyle Austin. The purpose of the benefit was to host a contest and professional demonstrations by wake boarding, surfing, and skating gurus, raising money for the local folks affected by the 5.8 magnitude earthquake of August 23rd, which was centered in Mineral.

In addition to water sports, vendors pulled together to help raise money for this worthy cause. There were vendors that donated raffle prizes, gave a portion of their sales proceeds, or simply volunteered their time. The generous group of vendors and volunteers included alliancewake.com, Lake Is Great, Liquid Metal Tattoo, Stultz Clothing, Island Mochas, Backwuds Skateboards, Red Bull, and Supra Boats.

The riders, both amateur and professional, braved the chill in the air to "shred" for the day. Riders included Matt Hayden, Kyle done Austin, Kyle Barmoy, Zach Tarleton, Tyler Talbert, John Ketchum, and diffe Steve Britts, just to name a few.

Some finished their set only to have their lips turn blue from the chill, searching for dry, warm clothes.

On behalf of our tight-knit community, I would be remiss if I didn't thank the good people at Christopher Run Campground for allowing a beautiful venue in which to raise funds. They generously donated the \$10 entry fee to the campground to the Earth-qwake. It wasn't just a day for doing a great thing for our community – there were introductions to new friends, reunions with old ones, and the general camaraderie of the community.

The benefits for our community continue today. You may ask yourself, "Why benefits? Didn't insurance cover damages from the earthquake?" Unfortunately, the answer is "no". Unless the affected party obtained an "earthquake rider" with their insurance, the damages are not covered. It's an unfortunate reality, that some homeowners found their homes condemned. Their safe haven, a place where so many memories dwelled, was declared uninhabitable. As well, schools, such as Louisa County High School and Thomas Jefferson Elementary School, were damaged beyond habitation. As of October 14th, there have been 41 aftershocks, compounding the damage already done. The efforts by Austin and those like him are making a huge difference in the repairing of our

STRIPERS: The lake is in great shape this year, filled with plenty of fresh water holding plenty of oxygen and the temperatures ranging from upper 50s up-lake to mid 60s down-lake. Stripers will be feeding throughout the lake, but the three most productive areas will be down-lake at the third dike, even though the plant is not running, mid-lake from Sturgeon up to Stubbs and Holliday Mill, then all the way up either arm of the lake. In the

current, it is hard to beat the Pencil Popper worked on the surface. When the fish sound, convert to swim baits and spoons to catch the Stripers. There are nice schools working the mouths of Sturgeon, Boggs, and around the power plant. Mid-lake fish are turning on strong with the gulls exposing the numerous schools of Stripers. When approaching gulls working fish, cut your big motor off at least 100 yards before getting to the area of the gulls and use your trolling motor to take you into the area. Not only does your big motor spook fish and make them sound, but you most likely



will encounter fish well before you reach the area of the birds. Also remember to be courteous to other anglers and not encroach on them while they are working the schools. The stripers are schooled well around the splits chasing bait to the surface in low light conditions and schooling deeper in the 20 to 30 foot flats during the day. Run live bait on down lines or jig spoons and flukes at the depth you see the arches on your depth finder to catch these stripers. The pattern that produces the best this month for the larger stripers is running Big Gizzard Shad behind planner boards in the upper water column over water depths ranging from 25 feet right up to the bank. The fish want to fatten up and will attack the larger baits driving the shad up to the surface with explosive strikes. *Jim Hemby's Full Report is accessible at LakeAnnaGuide.com*

BASS- You can find fish all over the lake at this time willing to take a variety of baits. Look for them to be shallow for most of the month, as long as Old



Man Winter doesn't show up early! Search baits will be a great starting point for you as the fish are feeding up for the winter months that will be upon us shortly. Rat L Traps, Tigershad Spinnerbaits, shallow crankbaits will be good choices to start with. I will be using a Burton Minnow on a Scrounger Head alot this fall and winter. Top water is not out of the question either, I have caught several 5lb plus fish with the water in the low 50s on walk the dog style baits. My favorite is the Paycheck Baits Repo Man & Repo Man Late Payment! You just have to slow them down and not be so aggressive.

For those days when the fish are not as aggressive, shaky head rigged plastics and wacky rigged plastics will work well. Boat docks will hold fish on very bright and sunny days, you must be able to skip the bait as far under the dock as possible. Don't get in a big

hurry with the bait. Patience is the key!

Lemon-Oregano Grilled Turkey

Ingredients:

1/3 cup olive oil

4 medium lemons

1 tablespoon chopped red onion

1 bunch fresh oregano leaves 8 cloves garlic, divided

1/2 teaspoon coarsely ground black pepper

no-stick cooking spray

1 (12-14lbs) Butterball® Fresh or Frozen Whole Turkey

4.Cut the remaining lemon into quarters; place in body cavity of turkey. Add remaining 4 cloves of garlic and the remaining half of the oregano bunch. Spoon or brush some of the lemon juice mixture evenly over turkey.

5. Place turkey, breast up, on grill grate over drip pan. Cover grill with lid. Grill 2-1/4 to 2-3/4 hours, or until meat thermometer inserted deep in thigh reaches 180°F, basting with more lemon juice mixture after each hour. Let turkey stand 15 minutes before carving.
