

What is the fuss about? What are all these meetings about at Louisa about sewage? Is this something to be concerned about? I will try and put this all in perspective.

Sewage is a byproduct of a residential and commercial building that goes outside the building using a plumbing pipe. All buildings produce this product, commercial and residential. "Turn on the sink, produce sewage" that's how it works

All health organizations such as the Virginia Department of Health and DEQ say this sewage must be treated before discharged. Treated sewage is called "The Effluent". The discharge must be treated to a certain percentage depending on where the Effluent is discharged.

If it is in the ground for a drain field for example, the treatment process is simple. It goes into a Septic tank were biological treatment takes place, "bugs eat it" the remaining liquid is then discharged into the ground, gross but effective. The main problem with drain fields is that the system can fail. They also can pollute the ground water, "drinking water you get from your well". Once a drain field is installed there are no longer inspected to insure proper working conditions. If the Effluent discharge is thru a mass Drain field, the treatment is a little better but not much different than regular drain fields. Some mass units continue to have inspections on some tanks and some of the equipment.

On a Sewer Treatment Plant, usually in the area of high density or for commercial areas, the sewage is treated to the highest levels and then the effluent is discharged. Reporting and inspected daily, weekly, monthly and annually. This is currently regarded as the best method used in the world! Every city and municipality uses this method.

Now, how do these things get installed and what is the County's involvement.

Generally the County Planners and Supervisors approve areas for different types of densities and then turn over the approval for individual homes and buildings to Zoning. After Zoning approves the site plans which includes the discharge of effluent the State then decides where the roads go and what type of effluent disposal methods will be used.

Easy, right? Wrong! This County is now deliberating if they should step in and tell the state that their methods of discharge might not be good enough. That the County's elected officials should be in charge of Sewage Disposal.

How will the County decide what is a good system and what is not? Will they use Science? No, because that is what the State Health Department and DEQ use and if they want to supersede the State's Scientist then they must be using a different method.

What is that method? No one knows! What if they decide you have to use a system that doesn't work? Will the state allow it? What if the county cuts off all methods of disposal?

The board sent some resolutions to the planning commission, one which banned sewer treatment plants all together (the best method for sewage disposal). Luckily the planning commission sent the board an idea...maybe we should set up a committee of civic and business groups along with state agencies to come up with an idea for handling sewage. Great! The Problem is, that's already in place. The best methods are being used! That is why they are used! If they were bad systems we wouldn't be using them.

What's next? The County going to supersede the state? Somehow sewage is different in Louisa than any other place in the world?

Maybe a good idea is for the County to build a regional plant so that all of the citizens will receive something they deserve from their tax payments. We need a Hospital, Drug stores, Movie Theater, shopping, and many, many other amenities that can only come with the proper infrastructure. You cannot build hospitals and schools on a Porta Potty.

So why is the county wasting developers and citizens' time with nonsensical ideas of taking over for the State Agencies that are in place to protect us? Don't Know? Neither do I?

If you receive a letter from a group saying there is sewage being dumped in the Lake! You now know they are lying and if they are lying why would they? What are they trying to gain? No sewage is being dumped in Virginia. DEQ and The Virginia Department of Health make sure of that.

At the planning commission, civic groups and the business community agreed that the Louisa County is over stepping their jobs and agreed that a regional plant was the best answer to all issues with "sewage".


#### A special style on your special day can complete your look.

# The Lore of Lake Ar

I grew up a curious and inquisitive child. I had an unusual passion for the past and a desire to make some connection between the events affecting the lives of previous generations and the circumstances of the lives of those who shared the present with me. As I

look back on those formative years, I know now that I had the heart to become, if not a historian, at least a history buff. That I became a history buff and not a historian, I attribute to my high school history teachers... because of them and in spite of them. The history they taught me was as exciting as watching paint dry. 



### Outdoor Life at Lake Anna

#### Even experienced boaters need a free vessel safety check...

The most cautious boaters can sometimes experience unexpected problems on the water. That's why the U.S. Coast Guard recommends that all recreational boaters, including personal watercraft and paddle sport users, take advantage of the free Vessel Safety Check program every year. The courtesy Vessel Safety Check (VSC) is performed on your boat – whether in a slip, at the launch ramp, or in your driveway – by a certified Vessel Examiner, at a mutually-convenient time, and usually takes 20 to 30 minutes, depending upon the size of your boat.

What's In it For Me? Boats that pass the examination are awarded a distinctive VSC Decal that alerts the Coast Guard and local law enforcement that your boat was found to be in full compliance with all Federal and State boating laws.

What If I Don't Pass? If your boat does not pass, no report is filed. Instead, you are provided a written report that aids you in correcting any discrepancies noted. Often, a quick trip to the local marina is all that is necessary to obtain missing safety items and easily pass a re-inspection.

Why Do This? In a word – safety. You are left with the peace of mind that your boat meets minimum safety standards and that in an emergency, you will have the necessary equipment to save lives and summon help. Additionally, you will avoid substantial fines should you ever be boarded by law enforcement and found to be in violation.

Where Can I Get a Vessel Safety Check? Your local Coast Guard Auxiliary unit, Flotilla 87, on Lake Anna has members who are certified to perform vessel safety checks. Call Flotilla Staff Officer, Bill Shutt at 540-894-0181 or email him at fsove@a0540807.uscgaux.info to set up a VSC in your driveway or wherever you store your boat. The Flotilla also schedules regular VSCs at the local marinas around Lake Anna. Check with the marina for the Coast Guard Auxiliary VSC summer schedule.

#### March Madness!

It's about more than just college basketball... March marks the end of cold blustery winter weather and the beginning of longer warmer days. For an angler, it means it's time to go fishing! Below is a quick overview of what to expect for March on Lake Anna.

#### Bass

When the water reaches the magic temperature of 55 degrees Bass will "stage" or move towards the shallower creeks and coves. During this period the Bass will "wake up" and get much more active than they have been in the winter. The lower end of the lake is going to warm before any other area. Dike 3, Valentine Cove, Levy Creek, Rockland Creek, and Dukes Creek will be great areas to concentrate your efforts. Use ½ ounce to ¾ ounce Spinnerbaits, 5" Jerkbaits, and ¼ ounce swimjigs and swimbaits. Don't forget your favorite variety of finesse baits when the bite gets a little tougher or you are trying to follow up the other baits. I also like to use lizards and senko type baits on a Carolina rig. This technique allows you to cover a lot of water and detect changes in the bottom.

#### Striper

There are lots of stripers in the Dike 3 area. Many of the larger Stripers will be caught in the main rivers near Terrys run, S-turns, Christopher run, and Duck in hole creek. ¼ ounce to ½ ounce Swimbaits and Jerkbaits will be very productive in these areas. If you are a live bait fisherman use a shallow presentation during lowlight and overcast days. During bright sunlight go out to deeper feeding flats and use down lines.

#### Crappie

Watch for Crappie to move to some of the 15 ft rock piles, bridge pilings and brush piles. Use 2" pearl grubs and tubes and small and medium minnows.





# Crazy Good Eats by Monica Van Cleve

So anyone who knows me well knows that I try to stay as far away from chain restaurants as possible. Not for snobbish reasons but because I made a rule with myself years ago to support the local, mom and pop restaurants like the one my family used to own in Spotsylvania. I do have one exception and I feel I must share it with you to get it off my chest. Maybe it is my love for great seafood or maybe I just get sucked into their lively yet laid back atmosphere but Bonefish Grill is my dirty little chain restaurant secret. In fact, when I lived in China for 6 months I spent the last 3 months researching food I would eat as soon as I put my feet back on American soil, Bonefish Grill's Bang Bang Shrimp appetizer being number 1 on my list. Sad? Maybe. But they really are that good.

My dining partner (my Mom) and I walked into Bonefish Grill on a Saturday expecting it to be packed, and it was. We decided to sit in the open seating bar area to avoid the long wait for the dining room. I never regret doing this because you get better angles for "rubber necking" other diner's food plates since you are sitting so much closer to them. Bonefish Grill's menu is condensed into one page which I think is genius. It makes it easier for lunatics like me who take hours to decide on food selections and they also concentrate on a few things and concentrate on doing them well. We ordered the Singapore Calamari for starters which is described in their menu as Tender calamari flash fried and tossed with peppers and a sweet and spicy Asian sauce. Delicious! If you are one of the people who are still weary of calamari please leave the 20th century behind and step into Bonefish Grill for this starter. The juicy calamari rings were perfectly fried with just enough breading and the Asian dipping sauce was to die for. Such a great and welcomed alternative to cocktail sauce!

My mom and I decided to order our dishes on the agreement we would split them 50/50, not abnormal behavior for us since she is just as menu indecisive as I am. I went with the special which was Orange Roughy Piccata with scallops and shrimp and she had the Bang Bang Tacos. Let me just tell start off with introducing you to Bang Bang Shrimp from Bonefish. They are lightly breaded, plump and juicy shrimp that are NEVER over cooked (which is normally such huge problem for restaurants) and they are doused in a spicy, creamy, and perfectly balanced Asian sauce. It's hard for my mouth not to water when describing these precious little nuggets. For years they have just been on the menu as a starter but Bonefish has gotten smart and stuffed them in a tortilla with a little extra sauce on top. I think there was cabbage or something else inside the taco but I wasn't paying attention. It was all about the delicious shrimp now packaged perfectly inside a tortilla. Yum and definitely crazy good!

Orange Roughy is on my top 10 favorite fish list. It's light, buttery, flaky and non-fishy; all things a fish filet should be. Bonefish got it right with a light piccata sauce draped over the dish with flavorful capers throughout. The plump scallops and perfectly steamed shrimp in addition to the orange roughy made for a seafood explosion I won't soon forget. I was not feeling particularly healthy that evening so my choice of a side was the asparagus coated in tempura batter and lightly fried. The huge asparagus spears were succulent and tender ...did I mention they were fried? Yum!

From what I gathered from the menu and from "rubber necking" other diners food at the bar area Bonefish has a lot more than just seafood. If you're not a seafood lover I would still venture out and take a chance on a restaurant chain that always seems to get it right. The atmosphere itself is great; warm and welcoming and the cocktails aren't bad either! Give Bonefish Grill, located in Central Park on Rt. 3, a try and enjoy their Crazy Good Eats!
