





To The Breeze:





History is nothing if not filled with irony.

A few weeks ago I was in Berkeley, California, walking down Hopkins top." Street, just having left the North Berkeley Public Library. In the brief walk from the library to my favorite wine shop, I ran into a tall, slender young wine shop, purchased my favorite bottle of wine, exited the shop, and saw shiping in her church in Atlanta. the man still standing in the middle of the sidewalk.

What followed between us was a interesting conversation about the civil rights movement of the 60s. My perspective was that of a young teenager growing up in the South during the bloody days of violence aimed to preserve segregation in Georgia, Alabama and Mississippi. His was that of a well-read son of an economics professor at Howard University in Washington, D.C.. I was 19 when the Civil Rights Act was signed by President Johnson. My new friend had not yet taken his first breath.

His point of view was developed from what he had read and what he had been told by his father and his grandfather. To him Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., is a prominent figure in Black History. To me Dr. King is a prominent figure in American History. As I see the world, Black History Month, is a subtle yet lingering symptom of segregation ideology and a patronizing response. If full integration is to be the antithesis of full segregation, why would Black History Month be necessary?

When Dr. King was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in December, 1964, it as was as much in recognition of his unshakable courage in the face Kennedy was assassinated. History is nothing if not filled with irony. violence, ignorance and misguided governance, as it was in recognition of his success in leading a non-violent movement to awaken a nation to it's injustices and inequality. The Civil Rights Act became the law of the land on July 2, 1964. When he signed the bill into law, President Johnson said, "Let us close forever black man standing in the middle of the sidewalk doing nothing but standing the springs of racial poison." Edgar Hoover, founder, first director, and longest serving Director He had a small badge hanging from around his neck indicating that, of the FBI, once referred to Dr. King as "the most notorious liar in the country." Hoover was consumed by the notion that Dr. King and the civil rights movement was a conspiracy orchestrated by the communist party to foment anarchy in America. A serious study of civil disobedience during the 60s

could lead one to conclude that local law enforcement in Selma and Montgomery were sadly our nation's most notorious anarchists of the time.


Director Hoover was not the only powerful segregationist in Washington during the civil rights movement. Howard Worth Smith, U.S. Congressman representing the 8th Congressional District of Virginia, was a much more aggressive opponent of civil rights reform than was Hoover.

A graduate of the University of Virginia, a staunch conservative, a Southern Democrat, and an outspoken segregationist, the Honorable Mr. Smith

was also Chairman of the powerful House Rules Committee. Under the We both expressed our bias. They were complimentary, not contra- House rules of the day, all legislation had to pass through the Rules Committee. As Chairman, Smith refused to allow the Civil Rights Bill of 1963 to be brought forward for a vote and the legislation sat in "Smith's Gravevard" for almost a year. Finally giving in to immense pressure from President Johnson, Smith allowed the bill to pass through the Rules Committee and the bill passed in the House 289 – 126 on July 2, 1964. President Johnson signed it in to law late that evening.

President Kennedy had sent the civil rights legislation to Congress the previous June, where it sat in Smith's "in box" until November 20, 1963, when it was passed to the full House for debate...just two days before

I am sure that you are ready to get out of the cold winter weather and back into a bathing suit as soon equipment is safe to be out on the water. Here are a few great ways your friends and family safe on the water.

Make sure that no matter what type of boating you are going to be doing that you do a pre boating checklist before and after every outing. Make sure that you have enough life jackets for every persons on the vessel. The jackets must be Coast Guard approved and they need to be of the appropriate size for each passenger or the VDGIF (Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries) can award you with a fantastic citation for not having the proper equipment. You also need to check that your boat has a fire extinguisher. It should go without saying, but you also need to make sure that the fire extinguisher is full and not out of date. If you are in doubt at any time that it may not be proper, just stop by your local fire department and have them inspect it for you, so you know that you are safe at all times. You must also have a throwable cushion inside the boat at all times. Not only does it have to be in the boat, but it is not allowed to be inside of a storage locker. It must be outside within reach of a passenger so that you are abiding by Virginia State law. Make sure also to check that all of your registration numbers for straps and anything that may be out of order. They're a lifesaving and state tags are in the proper order and alignment on your boat so that you don't have any issues with officers running your num- out on the water. make the stop much easier for everyone on board.

There are many other precautions that need to take place as possible, but you also need to make sure that your gear and before you leave to get on the water, but these above are the most important in my opinion before you go out. Oh yeah - don't forget to prepare yourself for another season of good times while keeping to CHECK THAT YOUR PLUGS ARE IN. No one wants to see a sinking boat on their first day of summer!

> Make sure that all of your water sports gear is inspected properly so you know that it won't malfunction when on the water. You need to visually inspect your wakeboard bindings, ski bindings and tow ropes for any cracking or problems that may have occurred during the off season. Checking that your hardware is nice and tight is also a priority. You don't want to get out on the water and realize you don't have a screw driver to tighten down your bindings that are loose. Checking your tow ropes for slices and tears is a big deal, as well. When a rider is in tow, you don't want them getting injured because of a simple tow rope malfunction. Check your towables for holes and tears. When filling up your tubes for the season, pouring soap and water over them will help to insure that you don't have holes. If you put soapy water on an inflated tube, it will bubble in any area that has a small pinhole. Local wakeboard and watersports equipment shop Wake Edger's Gear and Gifts has tube patch kits if you run into this problem. Life jackets need to be clearly checked piece of equipment that needs to be looked at EVERY TIME you go

For the second time in 2014 the Angler of the Month award for the state of Virginia was presented to a regular Lake Anna fisherman. On October 11 Mathew Bowen of Orange, VA was fishing in the North Anna River area of Lake Anna. He had caught bait earlier in the afternoon but was running low. Shortly after rigging the last bait in the tank (which happened to be the smallest threadfin he had caught) the fish bit and the fight was on. Bowen made short work of the fish and soon had his 39.5" trophy weighing in at 23 lbs 7oz. Bowen's catch qualified for the Virginia Angler's Recognition Program (VARP) by both length and weight. The fish was taken to Sturgeon Creek Marina where it was weighed and witnessed. Shortly after receiving his certificate for the trophy catch, Bowen received a letter from the

Director of Virginia Department Of Game and Inland Fisheries in charge of VARP congratulating him on his catch and naming him "Angler of the Month" for having caught the largest Striped Bass in the state for the month of October. After no Lake Anna striper angler winning this award for the past 8 years, Lake Anna has produced two tremendous trophies in less than 6 months. This is not only a tremendous accomplishment for the angler but serves as a reminder that there are still GIANT Stripers in Lake Anna.

It's about more than just college basketball ... March marks the end of cold blustery winter weather and the beginning of longer warmen days. For an angler, it means it's time to go fishing! Below is a quick overview of what to expect for March on Lake Anna.

Bass

When the water reaches the magic temperature of 55 degrees Bass will "stage" or move towards the shallower creeks and coves. During this period the Bass will 'wake up' and get much more active than they have been in the winter. The lower end of the lake is going to warm before any other area. Dike 3, Valentine Cove, Levy Creek, Rockland Creek, and Dukes Creek will be great areas to concentrate your efforts. Use 1/2 ounce to 1/4 ounce Spinnerbaits. 5" Jerkbaits, and ¼ ounce swimjigs and swimbaits. Don't forget your favorite variety of finesse baits when the bite gets a little tougher or you are trying to follow up the other baits. I also like to use lizards and senko type baits on a Carolina rig. This technique allows you to cover a lot of water and detect changes in the bottom.

Striper

Many of the larger Stripers in March will be caught in the main rivers near Terrys run, S-turns, Christopher run, and Duck in hole creek. ¼ ounce to ½ ounce Swimbalts and Jerkbalts will be very productive in these areas. If you are a live balt fisherman use a shallow presentation during lowlight and overcast days. During bright sunlight go out to deeper feeding flats and use down lines.

Crappie

Watch for Crappie to move towards shallow water... There will be thousands of slabs in shallow brush rocks and docks. Grubs and minnows will load the cooler.



I had heard a lot of great things about Mason Dixon Café and decided to give it a try for myself. They make everything in house and from scratch, plus boast some interesting eats so it was a great place to get my comfort fix. Owned and operated by husband and wife, Kelly and Nick Hunt, Kelly a local native and Nick a transplant from South Jersey, hence the name. Kelly's vision is comfort food with a twist and she delivers that vision with a home run.

#SouthernSoulFood - From the Low Country in South Carolina to the French Quarters in New Orleans, a hot, creamy bowl of real Shrimp and Grits fills the soul and warms the heart like few things can. Mason Dixon Café served up a heaping, steaming bowl of al dente large grain grits that were so creamy they blended with the silky-smooth cheese and just the right amount of seasonings and spices which made for a savory 'gravy'. Digging my spoon in to break open the surface I found medium-sized plump, white shrimp, sautéed yellow onions and red pepper strips that added to the overall savory flavor and beauty. Delish! **#GetInMyBelly** - The menu has a large selection of Gour-

#GetInMyBelly - The menu has a large selection of Gourmet Dogs, yes, Gourmet Hot Dogs. The 'G' Dog is hand held artery clogging, comfort food at its best. A Bacon-wrapped hot dog that is deep fried, placed on a toasted bun and topped with grilled mac and cheese...a meal all in one! The crispy grilled cheese from the mac-n-cheese acts as a top as the creamy cheese in the inside mac-n-cheese smothers the bacon-wrapped hot dog and the bun lets you hold it all with just one hand. This should not be legal. At this point I was thrilled it was so cold out and I could hide the 'damage' with my oversized parka because I wasn't about to stop now!

#RichRichRich - Next I was on to the Blue Cheese BBQ Chips. Fresh cut potato slices cut paper thin then deep fried and coated in a house-made BBQ seasoning (dry), drizzled with housemade blue cheese dressing and topped off with chunks of blue cheese. The perfect tri-fecta where "casual laid back" meets "fancy-pants". Rich, crunchy, sweet, salty, sharp and tangy. Kelly is really delivering on her "comfort food with a twist" vision.

Kelly says the weekend brunch has become very popular which with menu items like this and I can understand why. The café is a regular stop on Saturdays and Sundays for most of the regulars seeking things like a stack of pancakes the size of a birthday cake, chicken and waffles, crab and asparagus omelets and a club sandwich made with waffles. And if food really isn't your thing their BBQ Marys and even "Man-mosas" are reason enough to get out there for a weekend brunch.

Mason Dixon Café was the perfect spot to fill my comfort food craving and force me into sweatpants for the remainder of the afternoon. 

Lice is Not Nice by Heather Mechler-Fickes

It seems like every school year, one of my children brings home the dreaded notice informing us that someone in the class has head lice. I cringe at the thought of those creepy crawlers and then my head starts to itch. I immediately inspect all my kids heads -- especially behind the ears and the nape of the neck. They love to hide out and lay their eggs there. If you unfortunately detect lice or lice eggs in your child's hair - don't panic. It is an inconvenience, but if you are informed about lice it makes getting rid of them a lot easier.

Head lice are wingless insects that spend their entire life feeding off of human blood on the scalp. They don't jump from head to head, but they do crawl...and they can crawl fast. They are most common in school age or preschool aged children, but everyone is vulnerable to getting lice. Getting lice is no indication of your personal hygiene. They are just looking for a scalp to feed on. You can get lice from direct contact with a person who has lice or from "shared" items - for example: hats, scarves, brushes, combs, and helmets. I think a big culprit is when the kids hang their backpacks and coats together and those little bugs are crawling looking for their next "opportunity".

The best thing to do is nip the problem in the bud when you realize your child has been exposed. Go through their heads section by section with a fine-tooth comb. Lice are very small and sometimes hard to find. If they have laid eggs, the eggs look like flakes of dandruff but are not easy to remove from the hair strand. Purchase an over the counter kit. Usually these kits contain a lice killing shampoo, comb, and a lice and egg remover. Remember to follow all the kit instructions. You might have to a second application. Also, wash all bedding. There is no need to rewash all clothes and every bit of linens in the house. If you are concerned about some items, such as stuffed animals, put them in the dryer on high heat. If you are concerned about some items that can't be washed, you can bag them up tight for a two weeks. This should kill any lice and should get rid of the infestation. There is no need to bug bomb, spray pesticides or fumigate the entire house. Also, family pets don't spread lice and don't need to be given any treatments for lice.

If you ever receive the lice letter, don't fret, stop scratching your head and vigilantly check your family member's scalp.




