

During the first term Wash served after being elected in 2011, Louisa has collected over \$4.5 million in delinquent taxes, collected more than \$40,000 in county/school employee's delinquent taxes and over \$60,000 in public official's delinquent taxes. The collection rate for those years ending in March of 2015 is 99.02%.

Wash has been designated the title of Master Government Treasurer after completing the Certification Program administered by UVA Weldon Cooper Center for Public Service and the Treasurer's Association of Virginia. "This program gave me the knowledge of the tax laws as well as hands-on situations enabling me to better serve the taxpayer in our day-to-day tax situations," Wash said.

The Lake Anna Region's First Entrepreneur



The next time you're on public side of Lake Anna motor over to the mouth of Sturgeon Creek and look to the West. From there, you'll see arguably the Lake's most prominent feature, Dominion Power's North Anna Nuclear Generating Station. Nearly 300 years ago, this land on the South bank of the North Anna was owned by Charles Chiswell, an early 18th Century Williamsburg political insider and one of the lake region's great entrepreneurs. He would be right at home in today's economy.

Chiswell, whose name was pronounced like the tool chisel, was born in 1670 to a couple recently emigrated from Scotland. Little is known of his early life, however at thirtythree, Chiswell received an appointment to the Royal Governor's administrative staff and within two years, he had ascended to the key position of Chief Clerk of the Governor's Council. As Chief Clerk, Chiswell was one of a few people who would have had first-hand knowledge of all prospective colonial business activities. In particular, he would have had advanced notice of the opening of new western Virginia lands before they were publically offered as land grants. Likely due in large part to his position, over the next 20 years Chiswell was able to accumulate by land grant over 100,000 acres of lands in New Kent, King and Queen, and Hanover Counties. One notable transaction occurred in 1717. Colonial Lt. Governor Alexander Spottswood granted Chiswell a 9976 acre parcel in Hanover County near Beaverdam. It was on this property that Chiswell began construction of the current Scotchtown Plantation where he would also erect two mills and build an early iron-making furnace.

Robert Dunham, who later would become the most renowned iron-maker in the Middle Colonies, was hired

around 1725 to develop Chiswell's iron-making operation operations in 1732". William Byrd II was a very prominent into a profitable enterprise. To support this new business, Chiswell searched for properties within the York River Valley that contained sufficient quantities of iron ore that could be very frank in communicating his knowledge in the mystery

easily extracted and smelted. Also needed was a ready supply of wood to make charcoal for the smelting process. One such area was located on the far bank of the North Anna River. Records show that in 1728, Chiswell acquired 4975 acres of land on the south bank of the North Anna River on both sides of Contrary Creek to Franks Creek to the east. Chiswell

paid to the Crown authorities in Williamsburg 19 pounds 10 of the North Anna onto modern satellite imagery. Tools of-

Dominion paid quite a bit more for this piece of property as they began construction of the power plant in the 1970s.

Now, from your same vantage point on Lake Anna, look back up Sturgeon Creek to the Sturgeon Creek Marina. To the left of the marina on Route 208, you'll find a gray Virginia State Historical Marker. The Marker records that, "Charles Chiswell established the iron-making community of Fredericksville near this point of Douglas Run, a tributary of the North Anna River.







Resident Canada Geese – There's a reason for the season By Taylor McCann

Canada Geese are deemed a migratory bird and follow historical flight patterns known as flyways. These flyways and the habitat that lies within have been protected for decades to promote a healthy waterfowl population. Typically migratory Canada Geese do not pass through the Lake Anna area until late November depending on the severity of our fall / winter temperatures. The geese that you see through the summer months are known as resident geese. Many believe that these geese are decedents of birds that were stocked from other flyways during periods of low goose numbers or remain from the use of live decoys (now illegal but a common practice in the early 1900's). Because these birds do not migrate they tend to live longer, bread at an earlier age, and have larger clutches of young. Do to increasing numbers of resident geese and increasing goose / human problems, Virginia (and Maryland) have determined that the harvest of these birds is beneficial to all.



Although most people find a few geese acceptable, problems develop as local flocks grow. Problems include over-grazed lawns and agricultural areas, accumulations of droppings and feathers on play areas and walkways (a goose produces a pound of droppings per day), nutrient loading in ponds, public health concerns at beaches and drinking water supplies, aggressive behavior by nesting birds, and safety hazards near roads and airports (Maryland Department of Natural Resources).

The Canada Goose hunting season that specifically targets resident birds covers most of September. For specific information regarding the legal methods of harvest visit the Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries' web site www.dgif.virginia.gov . If you are experiencing goose problems in an area that is not conducive for hunting, the Maryland Department of Natural Resources (www.dnr.state.md.us) offers a number of suggestions for deterring the birds. Deterring birds can be expensive, time consuming, and requires 100% commitment. Hunting is considered to be the most important management tool for controlling local Canada Goose populations.

September Fishing Report

This month is all about the early transition from summer to fall. All species of fish will begin to cover more water and feed a little more aggressively than they did during the heat of the summer. Look for great top water action and shallower feeding habits as the water temperatures begin to lower.

Bass:

September totally changes the playing field when it comes to bass fishing. In the past month most fish have been in deeper brush and channel edges seeking comfortable water temps and feeding sporadically. As September sets in the fish will begin to move a little more and suspend over or near slightly shallower.



structure with bait present. Depending on how quickly the water cools they will start hitting spinner baits and medium range crank baits more readily as well as slow sinking weightless baits like Senkos and Flukes. September will offer some great days of largemouth fishing but it can be very difficult to adapt to the changes of late Summer/ early Fall.

Striper

The linesiders in Lake Anna will be in the beginning stages of all out mayhem on resident baitfish. They'll start to push up on very shallow flats and points in the mornings chasing gizzard and threadfin shad. Fan cast large shallow flats with super spooks and large poppers for the first 2 hours of light. Move out towards deeper water as the sun gets up. Once the fish have moved out of shallow water, use your sonar to locate schools of fish. You can use



live bail if you are proficient in finding, catching and keeping it alive. Or you can jig ½ oz to 1 ounce spoons and blade bails in the school. You can also troll crank bails and swim bails with great success.

Crappie

Nice size slabs can be found all over the lake. Bridges, docks, brush piles, and beaver huts, are home to thousands of Crappie. One method is to try casting grubs, tubes, and beetle spins or roadrunners as close to whatever cover you are targeting. Another approach is to use a slip bobber above a #6 gold hook tipped with a small minnow.










Developments on Track to Boost Louisa Economy

New projects in Lake Anna Growth Area will bring needed tax dollars to Louisa County

Louisa County should soon have more dollars to count. Projects like the Cutalong golf course, Sunset Cove, The Boardwalk on Lake Anna, Waverly Place and The Lake Anna Resort will fatten the county's wallet and provide much needed revenue to help increase the county budget, as well as create a commercial hub in Louisa County.

The current New Bridge Landing shopping center, anchored by

Food Lion and harboring stores and restaurants such as Subway, Chef Lee Chinese Restaurant, and a Virginia ABC Store will be surrounded by these commercial developments and will help create a commercial destination within the county outside of the town of Louisa.

The Lake Anna Resort could quickly become the lake's best tourism attraction.

Once this is established in Louisa, it can attract the best commercial entities to fill it's retail footprint.

The Lake Anna Plaza directly across the street currently houses a two-story commercial building, plus waterfront townhomes. The development still has space set aside for further commercial development and with a number of needed additional rooftops, plus the success of the Food Lion shopping center, it's likely that this space will attract needed entities, such as a medical center, a bank, dry cleaners, and other services desired by area residents.

The development process has been lengthy for golf course community, Cutalong, but the development of more than a thousand

acres creates a lot of work to be done for developers. In recent months, the infrastructure, model home, and the first few golf holes have been in construction. The added benefit of a golf course here on the shores of Lake Anna will be an exciting draw for golf enthusiasts in our region.

Waverly Place opened its doors in Louisa last year and has be-

come a popular location for local residents looking to rent apartments in Louisa.

Sunset Cove will feature 65 individual homesites in the development, with sites clusters at the waterfront. This type of cluster development is desired by the county so that infrastructure and maintenance are streamlined and more open space on the property is possible.

The Lake Anna Resort will be presented to the Board of Supervisors with a similar design that hosts luxury one-level condo units rather than single family homes. The access to a single level, maintenance-free living is currently unavailable at Lake Anna. The demand has been strong, with more than half of the planned 60 units already under reservation prior to the groundbreaking.

Louisa County is in the position to have several developers working to bring a variety of needed housing options in a responsible way to the area and shows the vitality of Louisa County in today's real estate market. The added benefits of generated tourism and tax revenue will only help the county as it moves into the future.





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
