A Commonsense Plan of Action by Duane Adams

Well before the end of the last century no one in Virginia would start a business in a community that didn't have electricity. Frankly very few of us would ever want to live, work, raise a family or retire without it.

In fact, electricity was deemed so vital to America's future and prosperity that Congress created rural co-ops to ensure every family was connected. With local investments wires were strung across America until everyone was connected.

Today that critical utility is broadband Internet, which is a vital component of our society and our economy. Business leaders and homeowners look for fast, reliable Internet service like they look for good schools, quality roads and bridges, and modern conveniences.

I know this is a critical need to many in our community, which is why I've done the research to move forward. I won't just talk about what we need as your Supervisor, I'm ready to act.

Fve met with the CEO of the Central Virginia Electric Co-Op, spoken with representatives of Rappahannock Electric Co-Op, the CEO of Bath Allegheny and Rockbridge Electric Co-Op where they are investing \$20 million dollars without local government funds to bring fiber optic internet to their community. I've spoken with executives from Mid-Atlantic Broadband who serve all U.S. Air Force bases around the world, and I've traveled to the panhandle of Oklahoma to research broadband Internet at speeds in excess of 50Mbps in extremely rural arcas. That kind of speed lets users download high-resolution photos in seconds and HD quality video in mere minutes.

Line-of-sight Internet through a series of newly constructed towers is a mediocre technology at best with very little room for future improvement. This is technology that does nothing to help expand our economic base or attract business to Louisa County. Without a doubt, what I've learned is there's only one way to go: hardwired fiber optic – it's the future-proof technology we can rely on for this generation and the next. By partnering with neighboring counties through regional alliances we can act to reduce government regulation and red tape to incentivize action to bring this critical infrastructure to our citizens.

Sadly, the Louisa Board of Supervisors has spent tens of thousands of dollars to "study" the issue of bringing broadband access to the county and they've earmarked more than \$1.1 million for line-of-sight technology that simply isn't the solution we need long term. I can't say it more clearly – we don't have to spend another \$50,000 (which is still in the budget) to study a failed technology nor, do we have to commit to millions more. Our County leadership is proposing to spend millions of tax dollars on "flip phone" technology when we are in the "smart phone" era. This is short sighted at best and wastes the hard earned tax dollars of our citizens.

What they're doing is just plain wrong.

The Broadband Commission in Bristol, VA spent \$130 million of taxpayer money without providing Internet access as they promised – and ended up selling the infrastructure for only \$50 million. Across America governments have failed – in Tennessee, Louisiana, Connecticut, Vermont, Utah and dozens of other places – while real solutions exist in the private sector without risking huge sums of taxpayers' hard-earned money.

Hardwired fiber optic can be installed like electricity. We can use the same infrastructure that was created to bring 20th century technology to American homes and businesses to bring 21st century technology to Louisa County. Real leadership looks for solutions; I know the answer is not bigger government or throwing taxpayer money at an issue in which our county has no knowledge or experience. There is a better way.

I know by leveraging a limited amount of resources and finding the right partners – who can use the successful rural electric co-op methods of the past – we can truly transform our county and make it attractive to the businesses of the future without losing the quality of life that makes us the envy of Virginia.



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Waddell's Bash

Jimmy Waddell made it very clear to his soulmate Katrina that he didn't want a typical funeral... he wanted a big party. So when Jimmy died in July from a motorcycle accident, Katrina found herself surrounded with lots of compassion and support from their extended family of riders and friends and even friends of friends from the area.

Waddell's Bash was held at One Life Cycles on Fenton Road owned by Bucky and Robin Wheeler. The party was just that - a big Bash which started with a statement of support as Jimmy and Katrina's extended family along with the Tuckahoe riders arrived as a continuous unbroken flow of support for a their fellow fallen rider.

Katrina admits that sometimes the public sees bikers as a rough burly crowd but after spending the last 10 years riding herself, she is proud to say that many riders are middle aged, family oriented professionals, business owners or ex-military. One thing they almost all have in common besides their love of riding is a kind giving heart. Most riders are known for supporting many charities and community events. Although Waddell's Bash was not a charity event , Katrina found herself overwhelmed by the support she received from not only her motorcycle riding family but the entire area of Lake Anna, Spotsylvania and Louisa.

It's no secret that Lake Anna is becoming a popular destination for riders, as I have personally seen an increase of groups riding together. They too are attracted to the rural scenery and, of course, our beautiful lake. After covering Waddell's Bash and meeting so many supportive and kind bikers, I think differently now when I see a biker riding past.













Late summer and early fall fishing on Lake Anna is tremendous. During low light condition (early morning, late evening, and overcast / rain) schools of juvenile threadfin shad will come to the surface attracting the attention of predators. These schools of baitfish can be as small as a beach towel or as large as your house. As predators begin feeding you will see the water begin to boil, baitfish jumping out of the water, and breech feeding. If bass or stripers are present you will be able to see and hear this feeding activity from a distance. This can last for a few minutes or over an hour. For any fisherman this is an exciting event and the first inclination is to get there as soon as possible so that you can get your hook into the chaos. Having a better understanding of what is taking place will help you prolong the action, learn how to reproduce it, and ultimately catch more fish.

Your first concern should be not spooking the fish. You can do this by running your gas motor sparingly and at low rpm's. Make your final approach with the electric motor or by allowing the wind to push you through the fish if conditions allow. Be careful not to drop anything in the boat, slam hatches, or trim your motor.

As you observe the blitz take notice of wind direction, current, and the general direction that the school is moving in. While this feeding action will take place over open water it will be much more dramatic as the school passes over shallow humps and points. By keying in on these environmental factors you can not only anticipate where the school will surface next but also predict where to start looking next time you are on the water. Once you have determined the direction they moving you can make a wide turn to get in front. It is much easier to allow the fish to work towards your boat than it is to purse them.

Once you are in the action you want to work the entire water column. While you can visibly see fish breaking the surface, a surface presentation may not be the preferred method to put size or numbers of fish in the boat. For the top third of the water column you should present poppers, chuggers, and walking baits to cover the surface. Soft plastic jerkbaits and lightweight swimbaits are also excellent choices for the top third of the water column. For the mid-range depths a ten-foot suspending jerkbait or heavier swimbait is hard to beat. Spoons and deep diving crankbaits should round out your arsenal and get down to the bottom third of the water column. Be sure to probe all depth during a surface feeding frenzy. Even though small fish may have the bait pinned at the surface, big fish will often lay beneath. As water temperatures begin to cool off in late summer it becomes more common for big fish to school in the vicinity of small fish and bass to school with stripers and large white perch as well.

Above all be courteous to other anglers on the water. Do not crowd anyone and never cut between the school and another boat that is casting to the school. If there is too much company for your taste remember that if conditions are right for this type of feeding action it's probably happening somewhere else. Use your electronics to locate the bait, focus on the surrounding structure and ambush points, probe the entire water column, and get ready for some fast fishing action because it is right around the corner!

The variable that drives all prices is the value of the land, so whether you want a house or a vacant lot you must understand what the actual value of the lot with or without the house should be. After knowing the value of the land you can determine whether the house that's already built is a better deal than the vacant lot plus cost to build. The waterfront land market runs anywhere from \$100,000 to \$700,000 for one building site.

We're lucky in that even the most inexpensive waterfront lots at Lake Anna are amazing, though it may have its issues that causes the value to decrease, it's still beautiful and may be perfect for the right person. The value is determined by the demand of the market, so if most people like long views and point lots, then the cost of those lots will go up.

You may find that you don't need that and are more interested in a good deal in a quiet cove, but this is the way the market is segmented now (see chart to the right).



The size of the lot doesn't add as much value as other locations (unless it can be subdivided into more home sites) because most Lake Anna Real Estate buyers are looking for less property to maintain.
