





tified fitness instructor, Tammy Starkey said.

Starkey didn't originally think that she would be a fitness instructor. She had been asked to be a soccer coach for her sons. They loved soccer, so naturally she wanted to accept, but this was when she realized how out of shape she was.

"I wanted to be more of an inspiration and example for them. So I shed 70 pounds and have been maintaining that ever since," Starkey said. "I didn't know it at the time, but it was a blessing in disguise."

It wasn't until one of her own instructors prodded her to become a fitness teacher that she got her certification. As Starkey began teaching her own classes, she fell in love. 19 years later, she still loves every second of her job.

"We started with 12 people in one class a week," Starkey said. "Now I have 30 students in my 8:00 am class and 15 in my 9:00 am class."

Starkey's fitness program is diverse. They try to keep things different for every class, which makes it fun and interesting for students. But her classes are about much more than physical fitness. Starkey emphasizes the importance of camaraderie between her students. It's a social experience just as much as a physical one. The relationship between fellow students and the fitness teacher keeps people motivated to come back again and again.

"When people come up to me and tell me their doctor has said they can come off their medication," Starkey said. "People in their 80's are able to play with their grandchildren."

The reward of seeing people being able to maintain a healthy lifestyle and better health status is worth every second to Starkey. Change, of course, doesn't happen over night.
